# What Gets Here Too Fast and Gets Over Too Soon? By Wayne Goddard

I've been thinking about the overall effect of our Show on the knife world and even on the city of Eugene, it really is a big deal and should stack up well with other three day events.

The Show started early for those at the Metallurgy Round Table at 9am on Friday, the set-up day. Phil Wilson ran the show and gave us the

benefit of his testing of many of the latest steel types. Frank Cox of Niagara gave us an update on their purchase of Crucible. John Steedman from Bohler told us about the steel types they have for knives. I need to rethink my out-of-date knowledge about alloy content and the effects the different ones have on a steel type, specifically adding nitrogen to steel. I remember one of the Crucible guys telling how one of their metallurgists blew up a furnace in an early attempt to add nitrogen to a melt.

The opening ceremony on Saturday morning is always something new and different. This year we had a bagpipe group in full dress with a drummer too. Their rendition of





Amazing Grace caused more than a few wet cheeks. It was inspiring and uplifting as we prepared for our battle to make sales.

Norton Crystolon/India stone. One modern addition to the process is using the household cleaner Simple Green on the stone which is faster cutting than oil or kerosene.

The "boys" from the 5160 Club were in charge of the forging demonstrations. Jeff, Dave and Lynn, with some help from Ray Richard, did the work. They got to use a new gas forge that is built by Three Sisters Forge. There are often complaints about a forge not being hot enough, not so with this one. It had a comfort zone of running really hot. The only work I had to do was to take some pictures.























# **The Silent Auction**


