You may still apply for a table after this date, but we cannot guarantee a table after December 15. NO RESERVATIONS HONORED OR APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED WITHOUT FULL PAYMENT! Note to NEW exhibitors: your table(s) will be assigned after 12/15/2023. If you are adding an additional table that you did not previously hold, your location may be moved depending on the availability of the table next to you.

ALL TABLE-HOLDERS AND VISITORS agree to abide by the OKCA Show rules and to hold the OKCA, its officers, and the Lane Events Center harmless for any accident, loss, damage, theft, or injury.

ANY QUESTION OR DISPUTE arising during the Show shall be resolved by the Show Chair, whose decision shall be final.

If in doubt, check with the Show Chair ahead of time. The OKCA reserves the right to bar any item from display or sale. No firearms may be sold or shown at this Show.

ALL EXHIBITORS are required to keep their tables set up throughout the public hours of the Show: 8 AM Saturday to 3 PM Sunday. ANY EXHIBITOR WHO LEAVES OR COVERS THEIR TABLE BEFORE 3 PM SUNDAY FORFEITS FUTURE RESERVATIONS AND WILL BE DENIED TABLES AT FUTURE OREGON KNIFE SHOWS.

DISPLAY TABLES will be around the perimeter of the room. Displays are eligible for display awards, which are hand-made knives donated by members and supporters of OKCA. Display judging will be by rules established by OKCA. Special category awards may also be offered. NOTHING MAY BE SOLD FROM DISPLAY TABLES.

SALE/TRADE TABLES Sharing of tables will not be allowed. Exhibitors must comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws. Oregon has NO SALES TAX.

BADGES: Each table-holder is entitled to one additional Show badge. NO EXCEPTIONS.

KNIFEMAKERS who are present and are table-holders at this Show may enter knives in the knifemaking award competition.

FOR MORE INFORMATION on categories and judging criteria in the display and hand-made knife competitions, contact the Club.

SHOW FACILITATORS will be provided by OKCA from 9AM Friday until 4 PM Sunday. However, exhibitors are responsible for watching their own tables. Neither the OKCA nor the Lane Events Center will be responsible for any loss, theft, damage, or injury of any kind. **CITY AND COUNTY REGULATIONS** require that there be:

• No Smoking within the Exhibit Hall at any time; •No alcoholic beverages consumed within the Exhibit Hall during the public hours of the Show; •No loaded firearms worn or displayed at the Show; •No swords or knives brandished or displayed in a provocative manner.

NOTE ON SWITCHBLADES AND DAGGERS: In Oregon it is legal to make, sell, buy, or own switchblade knives. However, it is ILLEGAL to carry a switchblade knife, a gravity knife, a dagger, or a dirk concealed on one's person, or for a convicted felon to possess a switchblade or gravity knife. Most other states have banned switchblade knives. Under federal law, it is ILLEGAL to mail, carry, or ship a switchblade or gravity knife across state lines.



Display Knives at the greatest show on earth is easy By Mike Adamson

Displaying Knives at the Oregon knife show is easy, fun, and educational, and you could very well earn yourself a custom knife worth over a thousand dollars!

I've built 20 around different displays over the last two decades to bring to Eugene. Ι have never come in first place overall, but I have been awarded the opportunity more than a temporary adhesives like command strips or just plain gravity! Displaying your collection flat on the 8-foot wide by 30-inch-deep table can be done, but to properly view your collection, propping it up makes a world of difference!

In one of the simplest displays I've done, "Stainless Combination

themselves with the blades in the open

positions and placed them on the little shelves in the correct place letting gravity hold them there! Building the panel at home took about $1 \ 1/2 \ -2$ hours, ten minutes at a time in the evenings. I brought it to the show, laid out a table cover, propped up my



display panel, and put out my collection for display. Only 23 knives on this display took about 40 minutes to set up quickly! Breaking down was even easier. about 15 minutes.

dozen times to choose among the finest custom knives given out at the Oregon Knife Show! My collection of display award custom knives rivals my Bowie collection!

There are 12 knives being awarded to the displayers this year at Eugene! You can win a chance to choose one of these knives even if you are a first time displayer!

All you need is: 1. Knives, 2. A display table, 3. A way to label items (knives, ephemera, etc.).

<u>Anyone</u> from novice to advanced collector can easily display their knife collection. At the Oregon Knife Show. Most people would think you have to have a very extensive or expensive collection to do this. That is not necessarily so. A simple theme of brand or pattern, among other guidelines, is all you may need to create a knife collection display!

The one main thing to do is build a simple display board, utilizing simple wire ties, magnets under cloth, or

Knives" on a plain plexiglass panel, propped up at a decent viewing angle (Two plexiglass supports behind the panel as shown in picture). Two small "Shelves" made from a 3/8 square material are attached to the middle and bottom of the display panel. I then took black and white pictures of the knives in the closed position, affixed them to the plexiglass along with a short descriptive label, and took the

knives

As you can see on this display, one of the best eye-catching things to do with your display is to scan one of your most important knives down at a print shop and have it enlarged, mounted on foam board, and cut out to make a display topper! Adding this to a display is fun and costs around \$20 - \$50, depending on how big you go! But as you can tell, it makes quite a difference visually! On this coffin





bolster crown pen display, I used an

enlarged knife on glossy color photo paper on a foamboard cut-out. It looks REAL until you view it from the side.

In this display of Western Cutlery Knives, I added a small, simple glass display featuring a variety of pocket knives to the top of the panel. This helps to round out the display and creates a more compressive presentation.

In this advanced display of Fred James Bowie Knives, multiple techniques were used, such as mounting the knives in front of a mirrored surface to show both sides of a knife simultaneously. Using combinations of knives, photos, and memorabilia connected to the subject laid out in a symmetrical pattern. This gives a polished and professional appearance to the presentation.

Starting with the middle of your display with the most important material. Then, dividing the other material in half on either side is a very easy way to approach display design.

Nobody has the winning formula for displaying knives. A fresh,

out-of-the-box approach to displaying has won several new displayers a handmade custom knife for just a little creative effort!

There are fine people among the veteran displayers who would gladly lend their time and conversation to help anyone create a theme or develop ideas for a knife display to educate the knife enthusiast, properly show off your knife collection, and even win a valuable custom knife!

Using shadow boxes from craft and hobby outlets is a very easy way to create a knife display. You can mount them on one or more display panels for ease of transport and set-up. Using multiple smaller shadowbox cases propped up at all the same angle is an

easy display technique. Clever positioning and arrangement are easy to achieve. with a few different attempts, you will find a look and style of your own!

The main thing to remember is you are not building this display to impress a panel of judges! The display of your knives is for the education and enjoyment of everyone who passes by your table! You can tell a story with your knives, show off unique variables in your collection, and educate the knife-buying and collecting public about your knives in various ways, concentrating on blades or handle material, brands, or special patterns. There are more than a few ways to categorize your collection into a unique grouping or a particular theme. This is a rewarding and enjoyable way to share your collection. I hope to see you at the Great Oregon Knife Show in Eugene this Spring!
