We know there has been some angst in the knifemaker community on whether they would still have access to some types of steel with the announcement that Crucible Industries has filed for bankruptcy. We received an email from Dr. Larrin Thomas with an interview that he did with Bob Shabala of Niagara Specialty Metals. Bob says that they are now working with a couple of steel mills to replace what they were getting from Crucible. Most of the high-tech steels (Powdered Metallurgy Alloy) that makers are used to working with, will still be available in the future. There may be some short-term outages, but nothing long term. This is very good news. And, what's good for the makers is good for the collectors.

My Favorite Knife By Ron Stuntzner

The knife was made by David McIntosh of Hanies, Alaska. The Damascus blade was made by George Werth. The handles are Monmouth ivory and the bolsters appear to be some type of cooper alloy. It's my favorite knife because of the memories it brings back.

I purchased the knife in Skagway, Alaska while on an inside passage cruise in SE Alaska in 1998. Of course, Skagway is a big tourist destination for cruise ships which means I paid too much for the knife. But the purchase was the beginning of my knife collecting and when I pick it up, the

memories of the trip and my first meeting with Wayne Goddard come back to me. SE Alaska is



very special to experience. I really liked Skagway with its rich history of the Klondike gold rush, White

passed into Canada, Dead Horse Trail where thousands of horses died transporting miners to the Klondike and of course, the 1880's crooked sheriff and his deputies that robbed and killed miners. But after a couple of years the knife

started falling apart: loose blade, handles and bolsters. The knife was literally falling apart. So, I

> started looking to see if someone could fix the knife of which I had no clue. My research led me to OKCA and Wayne Goddard. I called him and he said bring the knife by. He was a person I immediately liked. Later, after looking the knife over he emailed me a full-page letter explaining what was wrong and how to fix the numerous problems, and saying about the knife maker "That's not a good

way to assemble a folding knife". Well Wayne fixed the knife perfectly and I love what he did. As a side bar, I had the opportunity to work on numerous forestry projects in SE Alaska in the 1990's to early 2000's. There are a lot of fine knife makers up there. I made some purchases from the I.R.B.I Knife Shop (I'd Rather Be Independent) in Seward and Richard Kacsur in Fairbanks.
